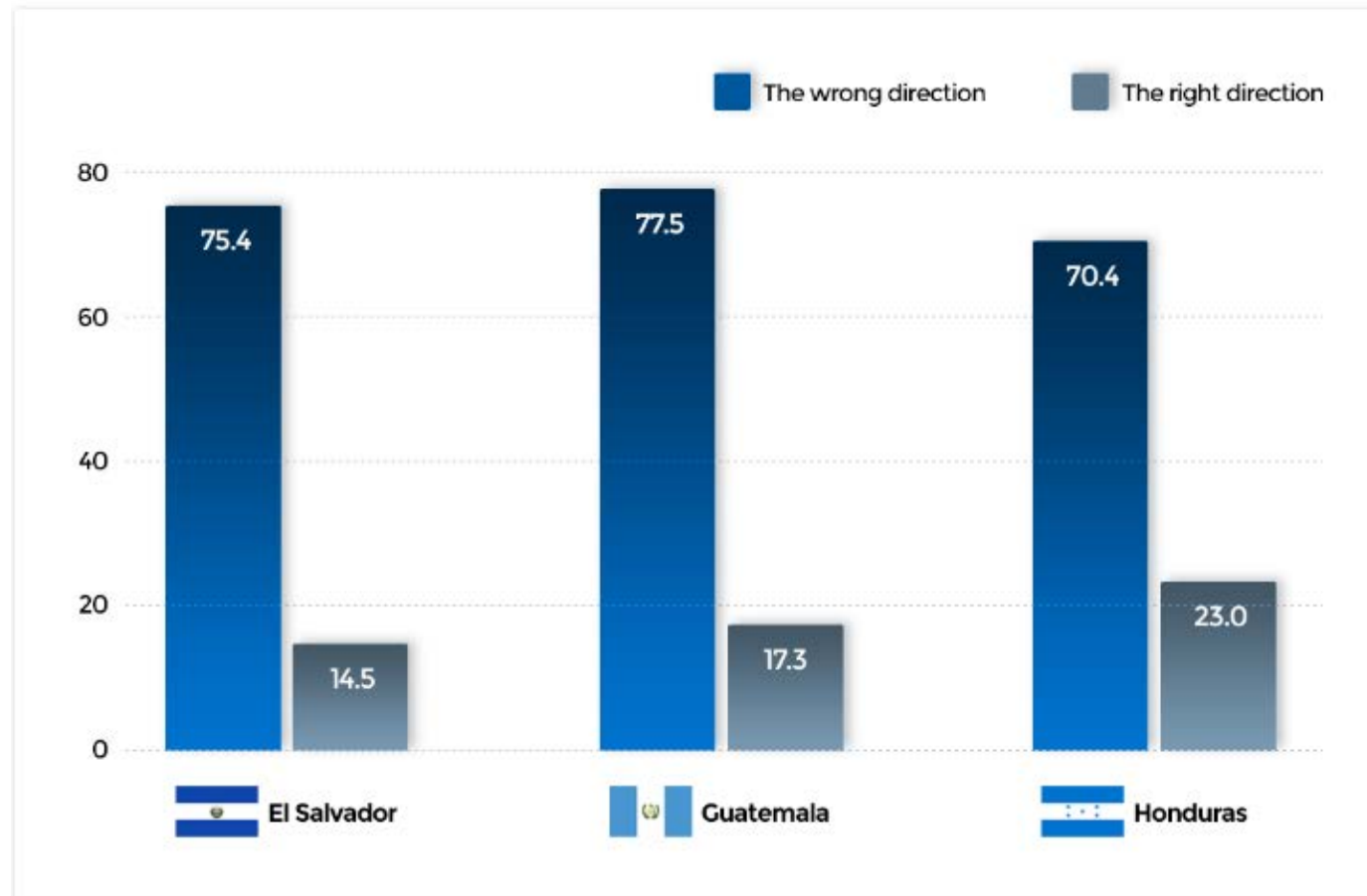

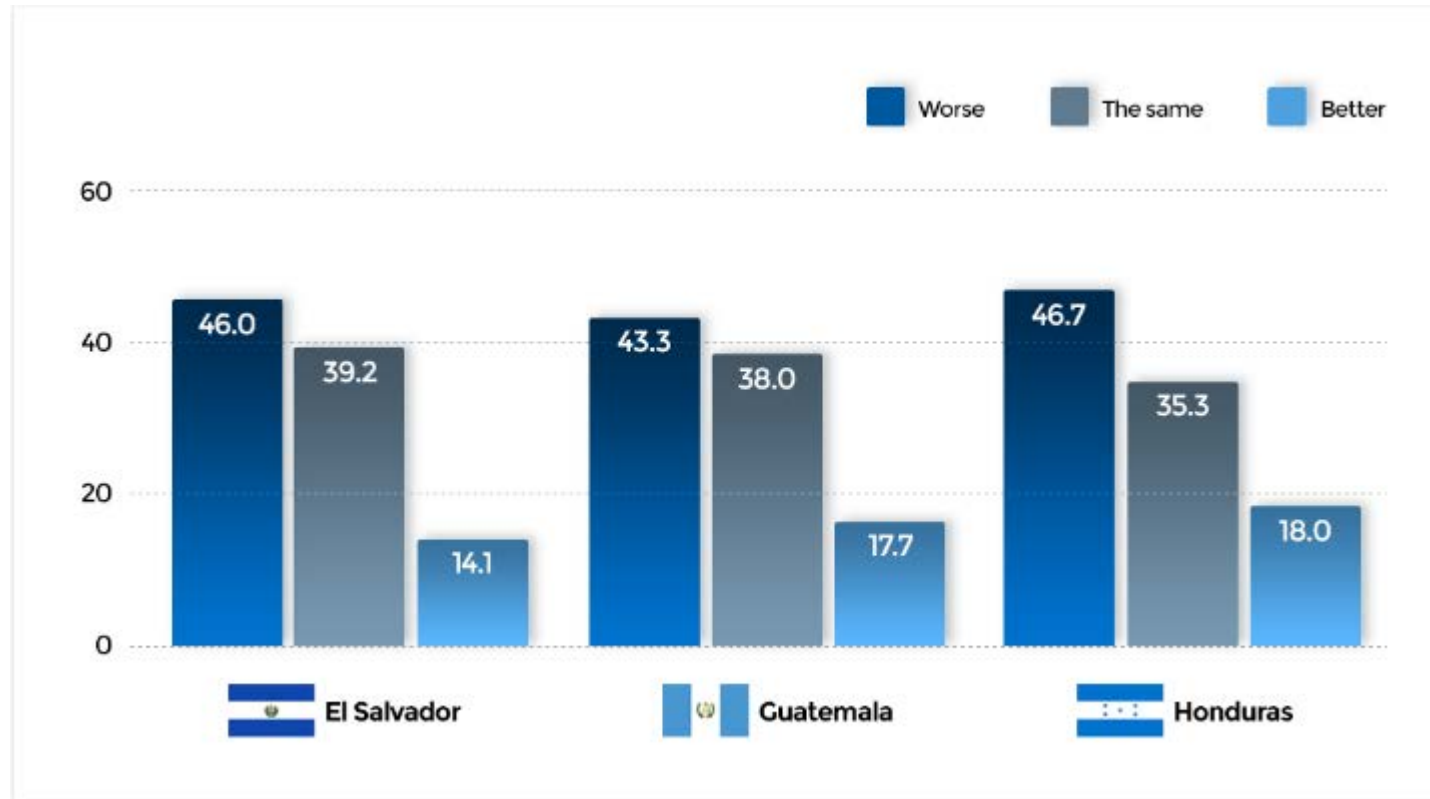
Atlantic Council Poll: Preliminary Results from the Northern Triangle

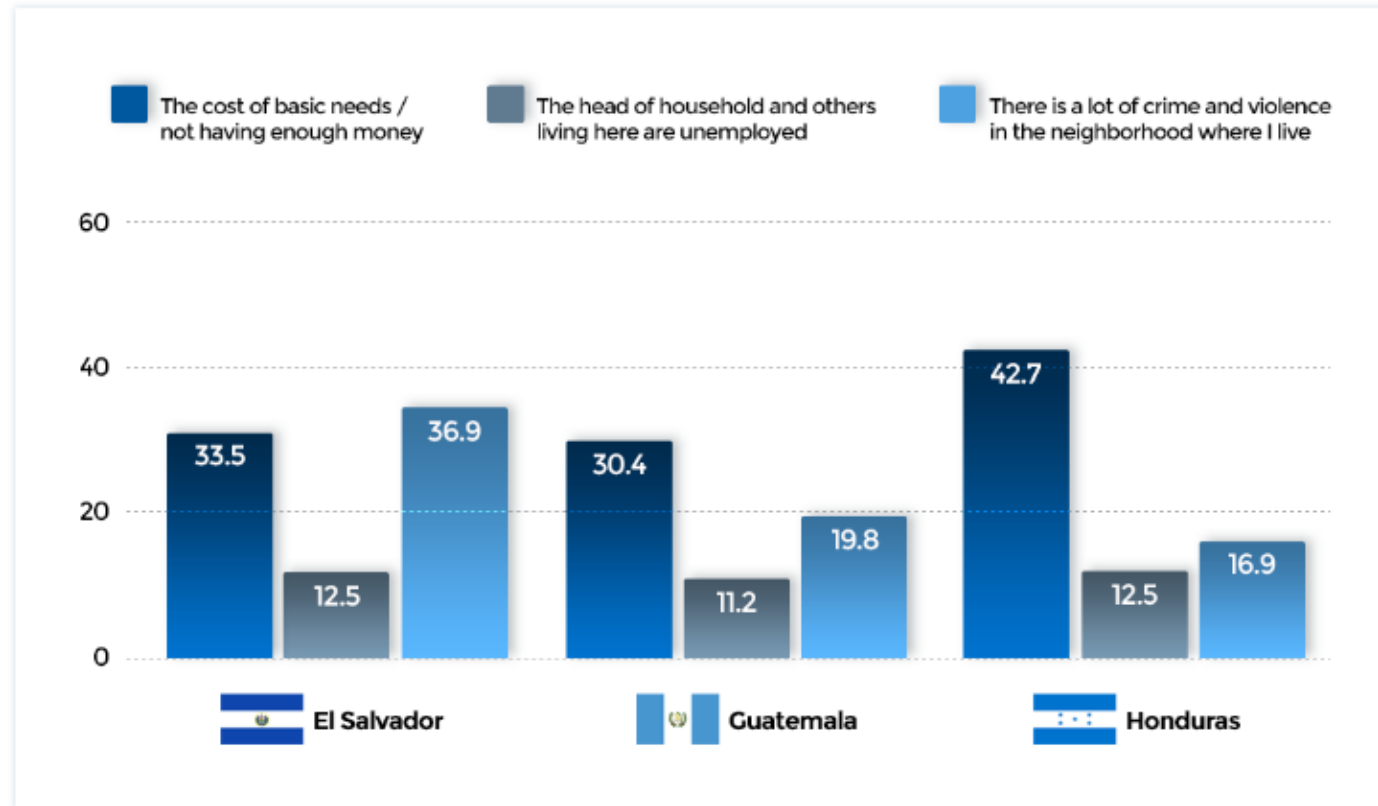
Is your country headed in the right or wrong direction?



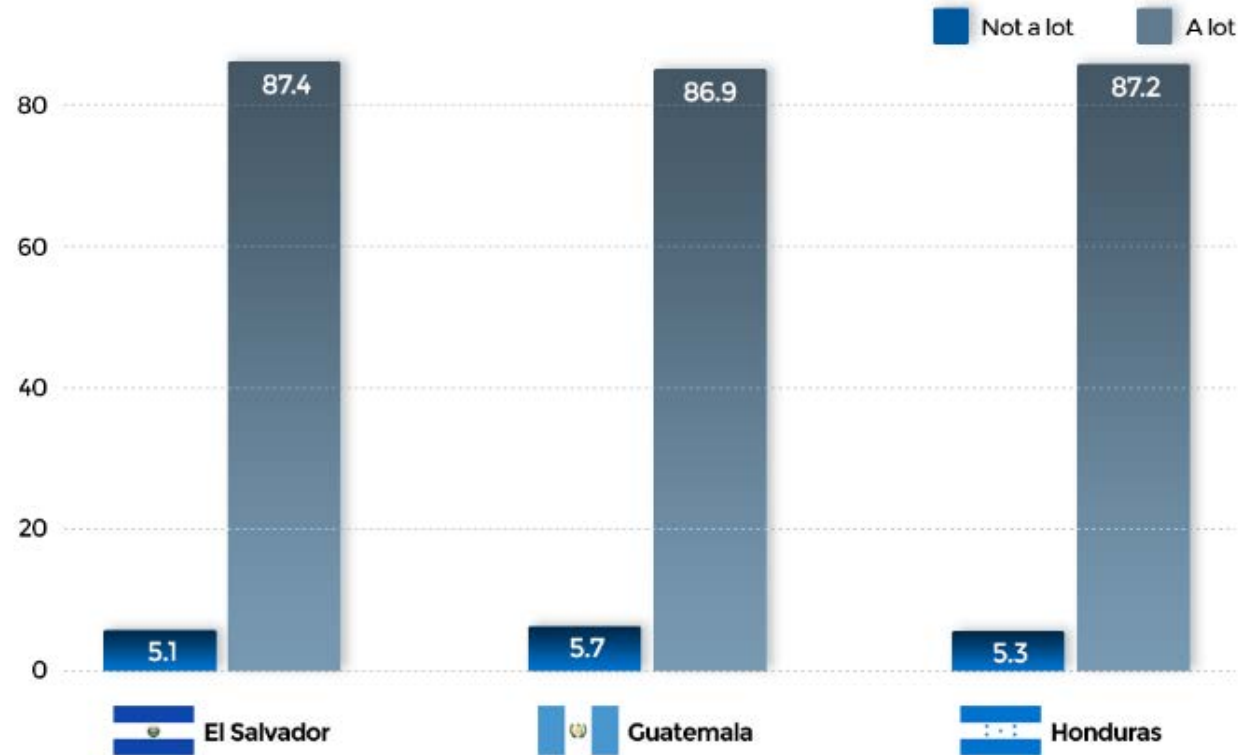
Is your family's economic situation better or worse than last year?



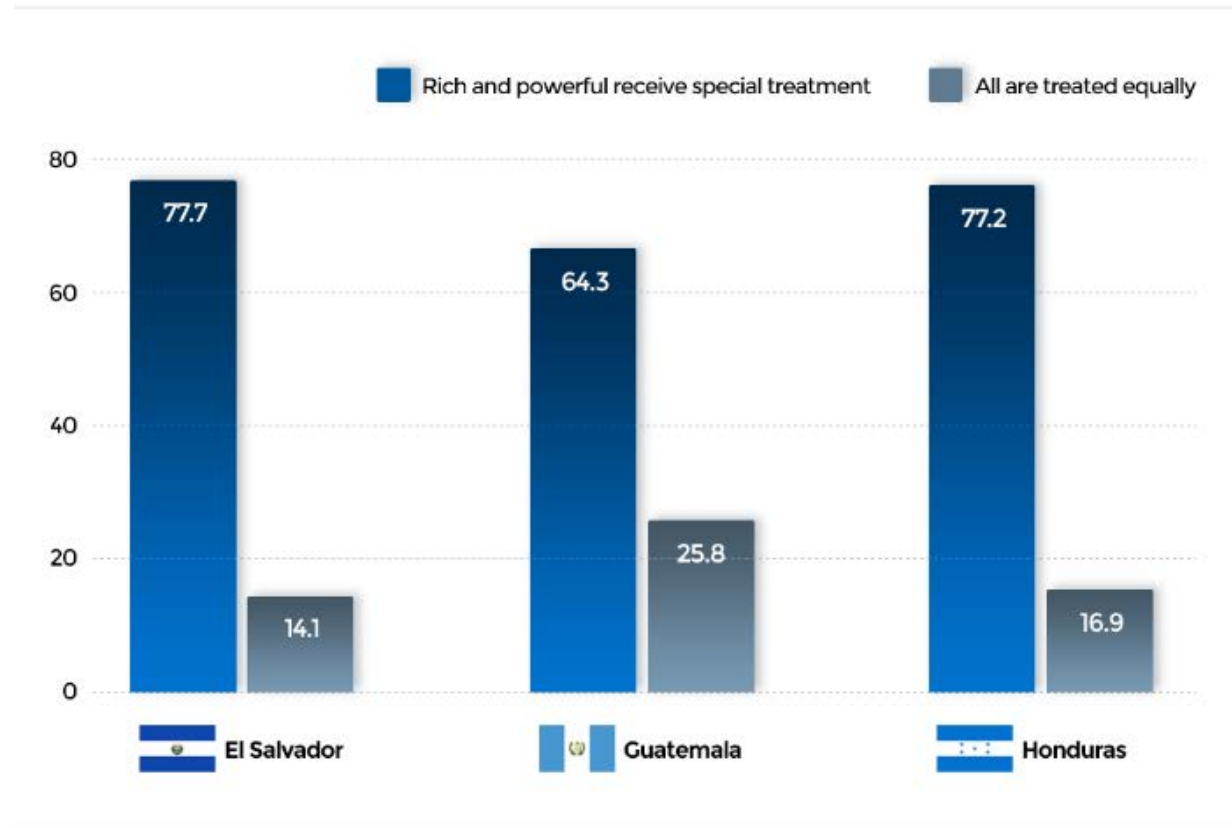
Top concerns for respondents and their families



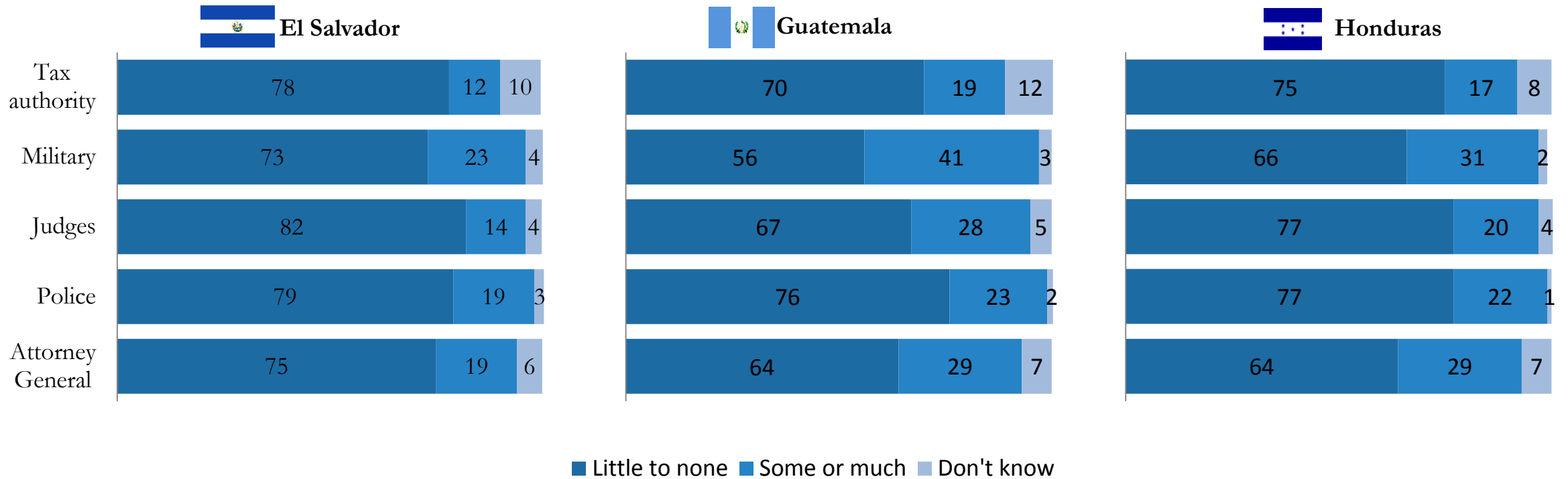
How much corruption exists in your country?
